

**ORDER OF THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF WOODWAY, TEXAS EXTENDING  
DECLARATION OF DISASTER AND PUBLIC HEALTH EMERGENCY FOR AND  
IN WOODWAY, TEXAS, AND TERMINATING THE CITY'S REGULATIONS TO  
PREVENT THE SPREAD OF COVID-19 IN DEFERENCE TO THE EXECUTIVE  
ORDERS OF THE GOVERNOR OF THE STATE OF TEXAS**

**WHEREAS**, previously the City has adopted regulations to prevent the spread of COVID-19; and

**WHEREAS**, the Governor of Texas is opening up businesses and activities, and has set protocols for the reopened businesses and covered activities as set forth in the Governor's collective COVID-19 Executive Orders (hereinafter "Governor's Executive Orders"); and

**WHEREAS**, based on the scope of the Governor's Executive Orders it is found that there is no longer a need for the local regulations, including the local shelter in place/stay at home order.

**BE IT PROCLAIMED AND ORDERED BY THE MAYOR OF THE CITY OF WOODWAY, TEXAS THAT:**

1. The foregoing recitals are incorporated herein and made findings of fact.
2. That pursuant to §418.108(b) of the Texas Government Code, the state of disaster shall continue until 11:59 p.m. on July 7, 2020, unless continued, renewed, or rescinded by the Mayor, City Council or an Order of the Governor.
3. In accordance with McLennan County's Order, which controls, that the City's local regulations related to preventing the spread of COVID-19 including the shelter in place/stay at home regulations, restrictions on businesses and activities, and other such matters are terminated in deference to the Governor's Executive Orders.
4. That the City retains the authority by law to enforce the Governor's Executive Orders. violation of the Governor's Orders shall be a Class C misdemeanor and the penalty for violating this Resolution shall be a fine of not less than one dollar (\$1.00) and no more than one thousand dollars (\$1,000.00), and each day a violation exists shall be a separate offense. That this declaration also hereby authorizes the use of any other lawfully available enforcement tools.
5. That pursuant to §418.108(c) of the Texas Government Code, this renewal, restatement, and continuance of the declaration of a local state of disaster shall be given prompt and general publicity and shall be filed promptly with the City Secretary.
6. That pursuant to §418.108(d) of the Texas Government Code, this renewal, restatement, and continuance of the declaration of a local state of disaster activates the City's emergency management plan.
7. That this Order is effective immediately.
